Music: Interdisciplinary Approach to History

Alexander Hamilton

Lieutenant Colonel Hamilton at the time of the Battle of Yorktown, Hamilton was appointed, at his insistence, as the commander of a light infantry battalion in Lafayette's division. During the battle his troops were able to capture Redoubt 10.



Music: Interdisciplinary Approach to History

Marquis de Lafayette

Major General Marquis de Lafayette arrived in Yorktown seven months before the battle: his primary objective at that time was to capture the traitor, Benedict Arnold. He was surprised by the arrival of Cornwallis at Yorktown and, with Washington, marched to Yorktown with 17,000 soldiers from France and the colonies. He commanded a division of American troops at the Battle of Yorktown and was present at the surrender of Cornwallis on October 19, 1781.

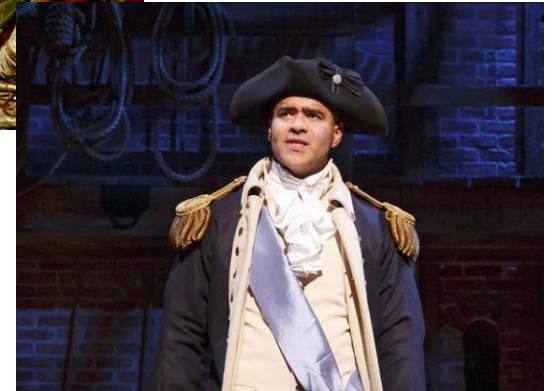
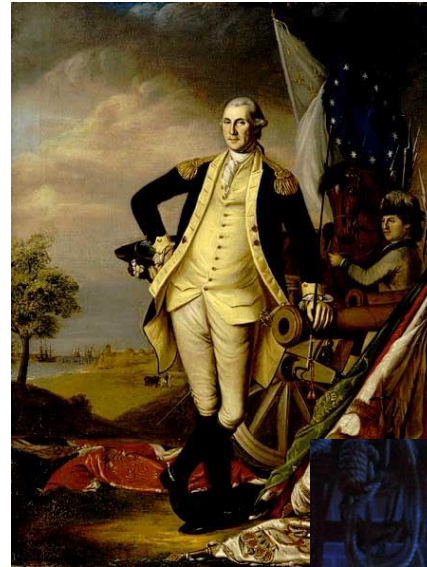

Interdisciplinary Approach to History

George Washington

General Washington marched his troops from New York to Yorktown, arriving on September 14, 1781. As the commander-in-chief to the forces, he coordinated the American and French troops.



Music: Interdisciplinary Approach to History

John Laurens

Aide-de-camp to George Washington; he returned from Paris, where served as a special envoy to Franklin, in time to join the battle of Yorktown. He assisted Hamilton in capture Redoubt 10 during the battle. He also served as the American commissioner in working out the terms of the surrender of Cornwallis.



Music: Interdisciplinary Approach to History

Hercules Mulligan

Mulligan was an Irish clothing merchant who immigrated as a young boy. He became friends with Alexander Hamilton when Hamilton resided in his home until graduation from Columbia. During the Revolutionary War, Mulligan operated as a Loyalist behind British lines and began to send correspondence to General Washington, warning him of the movement of British troops.

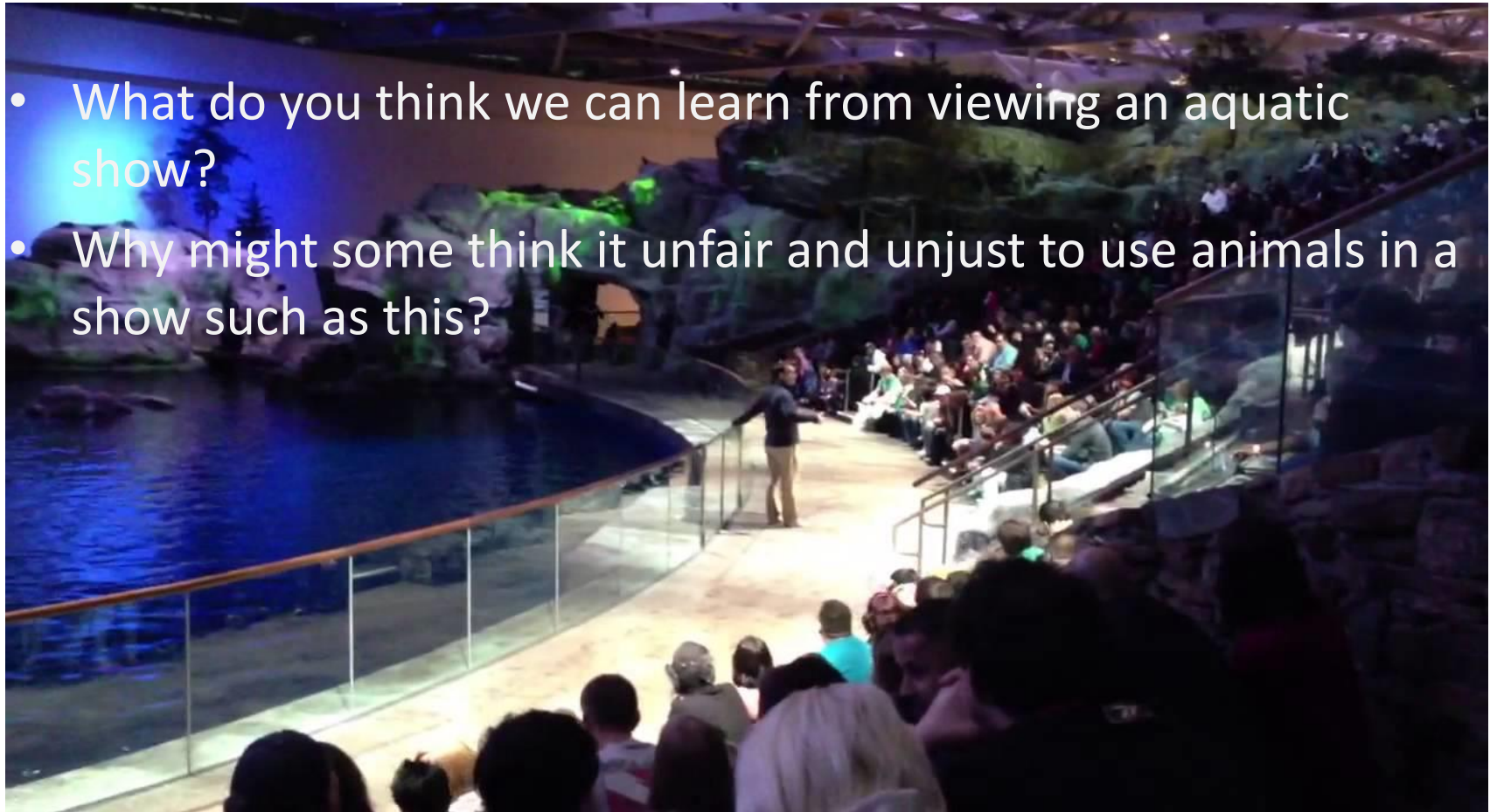
Ethics

- Why might some think it unfair and unjust to use animals in a show such as this?



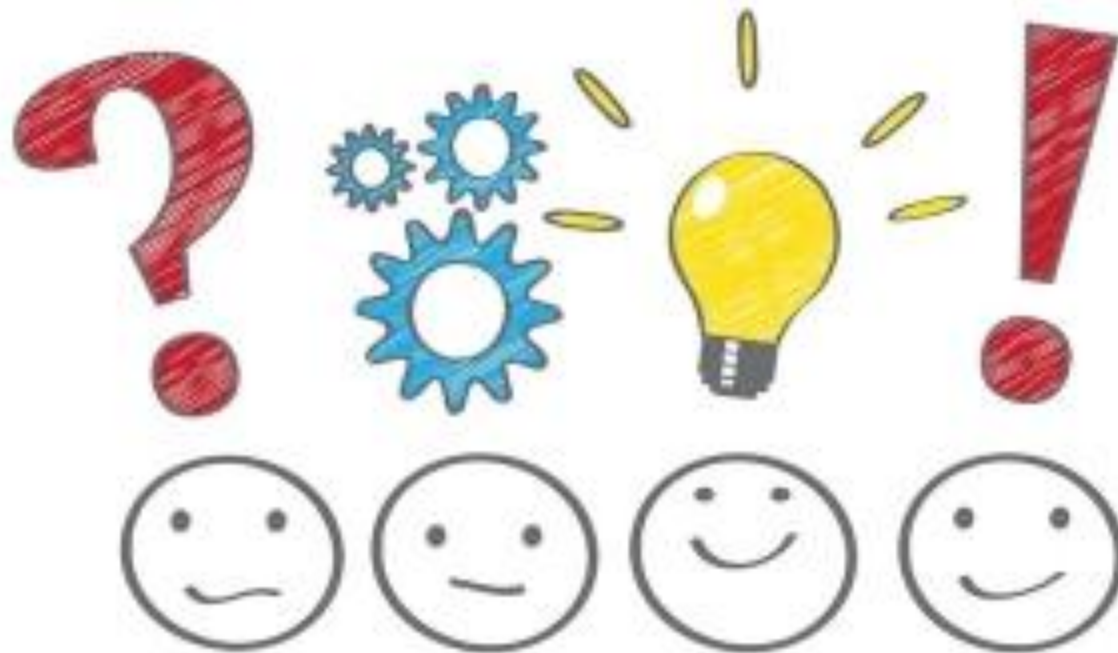
Ethics: Animal Conservation
