





SYTA Virtual Meeting CODE OF CONDUCT

SYTA is dedicated to providing a positive and harassment-free virtual event experience for everyone, regardless of age, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, disability, ethnicity, race, religion, or nationality. We do not tolerate harassment of event participants in any form, nor do we tolerate any behavior that would reasonably lead to another event participant being made to feel unsafe, insecure, or frightened for their physical or emotional well-being. All communication should be appropriate for an audience that includes people of many different backgrounds.

Examples of encouraged behavior that contributes to a positive environment include:

Use welcoming and inclusive language Be respectful of differing viewpoints and experiences Show empathy towards other participants

Unacceptable behavior includes:

Sexualized language or imagery Insulting or derogatory comments Personal or political attacks Deliberate intimidation or harassment Sexist, racist, or exclusionary jokes

Usage of Content
