The church served as headquarters from 1956 to 1961 for the Alabama Christian Movement for Human Rights, led by Reverend Fred L. Shuttlesworth.
- 9:45am 10:15am Our journey will take us to historic Kelly Ingram Park where statuary depicts the events that took place there, including the infamous dogs and fire hoses attacks on demonstrators.
- 10:30am 11:15am Across the street, the city's most famous civil rights landmark, Sixteenth Street Baptist Church, bombed by Klansmen in 1963 killing four African-American schoolgirls was the turning point in race relations in the country.
- 11:20am 12:20pm At the Birmingham Civil Rights Institute, we'll follow a series of galleries that tell the stories of a people and a movement.
