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SYTA Youth Foundation

Founded in 2000 by Rip Hunter and Cindy Brown, together with 26 charter members.



- The Road Scholarship was created. Five scholarships and \$3,400 were awarded the first year.
- Ripley Hunter "World is a Classroom" Essay Contest was established.
- The Silver Linings program was created. The first program, after Hurricane Katrina devastated New Orleans, brought kids from New Orleans to Chicago. This program is slated to return in Fall 2024.
- The "Acorn Fund" was created. Now known as the "Acorn Society" donations to this fund ensure the SYTA Youth Foundation will have a lasting impact for future generations of student and youth travelers.











SYTA Youth Foundation

- Carylann Assante joins SYTA and the Foundation as CEO.
- In partnership with Sea World Parks and Entertainment, the Next Generation Program provided interactive and innovative learning experiences.
- Disney Theatrical Group donates 100 tickets to the SYTA Youth Foundation's Students on Broadway program.
- The DC Rite of Passage program was created by the American Experience Foundation and the SYTA Youth Foundation.
- The Road Scholarship program surpasses 2,000 kids impacted with over \$850K donated in scholarships.
- Travel Insured International changed what it means to give back by donating a portion of their sales to SYF. To date, they have given over \$275,000 to support the Foundation's programs and scholarships.

- Acorn Fund achieves \$1 M goal.
- "Soar. Rise. Climb." campaign raises over \$70k with a matching grant from Music USAFestivals.
- GroupCollect commits to donate \$50K for two years, the largest one-time donation the Foundation has received to date.
- Annual Giving Society is introduced. Over \$278K was raised.
- 2023 annual auction broke records with over \$69K raised.
