Why is CSTS giving this presentation?

- 1. CSTS is a student travel safety consulting company and has several SYTA members as clients.
- 2. CSTS has provided previous consulting services to SYTA from 2015 to 2019.
- 3. In the fall of 2017, SYTA contacted CSTS to work on a few projects
- 4. December 2018- CSTS was asked to enter into an agreement to provide multiple services







What Services does CSTS Provide?

- 1. Develop Student Travel Industry Standards
- 2. Remain accessible to SYTA and its member for consultation
- 3. Deliver two presentations at Summit & Annual conference
- 4. Attend conferences, board meetings and other industry gathering on behalf of SYTA .

- 6. Facilitate the Safety Committee and develop direction.

Why Develop a Certification Program

- 1. Increasingly, administrators, educators, procurement officers and parents are seeking ways to evaluate and select student travel companies that meet industry standards.
- 2. As the Voice of Student Travel, it is imperative that SYTA take the lead in developing risk management and safety standards.
- 3. We may be one major accident away from government imposed standards on the industry

How the CSTO Works!

- Member applies for Certification when policies in place with history.
- Independent audit conducted to ensure evidence of compliance
- 3. Decision made on Audit result pass/open items/fail
- 4. Pass, 3-Year Student Travel Organization Certification issued
- 5. I year and 2 year from certification date, self audit required. End of 3rd year, reapply for Certification.







How will it be promoted!

- SYTA will promote the standards and practices to customers and stakeholders as industry standards
- SYTA Certified Members will receive recognition as a Certified Student Travel Organization (CSTO) with a special logo
- 3. SYTA will produce a press release.
- 4. SYTA will produce a CSTO brochure that can be shared with your customers







How much would an audit cost?

- 1. Most likely 1-2 day in person audit. \$1,000 to \$2,000.
- 2. Transportation, lodging and meals-\$550 to \$1,100
- 3. Application fee \$250.
- 4. Best current estimate, \$1,800 to \$3,350 once every tree years.

Standard format



Hotels (HTL) #1 - Emergency Evacuation Briefing

Each organization will ensure an emergency evacuation and gathering point briefing takes place on arrival at all hotel properties.

Requirement: Optional Included in self-assessment Applies to:

- Tour Operators
- Receptive Tour Operators
- · Travel Agencies

Application:

 Any trip or program where tour guide and /or chaperones are selected by tour organization.

On-site Visit and Self Audit Requirements

Written Documentation:

- ✓ Training document outlining policy and timing of briefing.
- ✓ Annual training of employees and contracted service providers

On-site inspection:

- ✓ Site inspector to review training material.
- ✓ Site inspector to audit training records including matching training rosters to tour name lists

American National Standards Institute-ANSI

When accreditation makes sense:

- ✓ ANSI accreditation assures that, participants-learners have achieved measurable learning outcomes at the end of a course or program
- ✓ ANSI accreditation provides educational defensibility to your program, conforming content validity and assessment validity and reliability.
- ✓ ANSI accreditation mark increases prestige and improves the market value of your certificate program for your stakeholders.
- ✓ The U.S. Department of Education (DoE) has selected ANSI-CAP
 as a quality assurance







How much would an audit cost?

- 1. \$3,000 Application fee
- 2. \$1,250 per day each for two auditors for 10-12 day for \$25,000 to \$31,000.
- 3. Two audit days on-site, hotel, meals, transportation \$1,800
- 4. Best current estimate, \$29,800 to \$35,800 every 5 years paid for by SYTA, not the members!
